## Gifts of hope for the needy

### Foundation brings festive cheer to single mums, children in Kajang

THIS Deepavali, OSK Foundation (OSKF) brought cheer to 40 single mothers and their children from Taman Restu, Kajang, through its "Gifts of Hope" programme.

In collaboration with Persatuan Kebajikan Kanak-kanak Kajang (PKKKK), the programme complemented OSKF's funding of free tuition class for the neighbourhood's underserved children.

Early this year, OSKF donated towards the funding of programmes run by PKKKK. A non-profit organisation, PKKKK runs various programmes, including providing free tuition and meals for children from needy backgrounds.



Run by pastor and former schoolteacher Susie Devaki, the centre also supports single mothers by providing them skills training and counselling sessions.

"We are happy to be able to bring light and cheer to these families this festive season by contributing towards their needs and celebrating together," she said.

OSKF chief executive officer Cheryl Ong said, "It was great to see them having fun with one another and with our volunteers."

The Gifts of Hope programme encourages OSK employees to volunteer and reach out to the poor by donating essential household items during the four major festivals.

During the event, each family received a bag of grocery items and shopping vouchers to help them with their Deepavali preparations.
